He is the author of the book 'From Yak-herding to Enlightenment: The Legend of Thöpa Gali – A Heritage Narrative of the Merak–Sakteng Community' published by the National Library & Archives in 2013.

She has carried out a joint research on Tibetan Diaspora in Bhutan, and presented a paper on Traditional Cloth Making in Bhutan during SAARC Regional Seminar on Traditional Knowledge and Traditional Cultural Expression in 2013 at Sri Lanka.
